## Action needed on business insurance

*'There has been a failure of regulation. There is a need for state intervention on this.'*

Alyn has urged the UK Government to take action over business insurance, as many coronavirus-related claims are denied payouts despite firms possessing pandemic disruption policies.

Questioning the Leader of the House of Commons Jacob Rees-Mogg, Alyn argued urgent steps are required to ensure businesses are supported.


## Small businesses must be supported

## Bruce seeks answers for B&Bs

Bruce has asked Fiona Hislop, Cabinet Secretary for Economy, Fair Work and Culture for further clarity and information on the assistance available for businesses who have yet to receive government support.

For some businesses such as B&Bs, this has been complicated by unique circumstances.

From June 15th, B&Bs previously excluded from support can apply to a £3 million funding pot, administered by local authorities.

## Call for UK Gov funding pledge to be honoured

This includes a reduction in charity support consequential from £35 million to £25 million, and a missing £60 million in business grant funding.

Proposals include offices, retail, residential and other infrastructure developments.


