Ukraine Conflict Continues

As the war in Ukraine continues the SNP have remained committed to the defense of international law and liberal democracy. Speaking in the House of Commons, Alyn Smith MP urged the UK to match sanctions imposed by EU, NATO, and G7 countries, as well as doing more to help refugees move to the UK much quicker. Smith also wrote to the Speaker expressing concern about lobbying of MPs by those with ties to the Kremlin, and has suggested that war crimes committed by Russian forces may constitute genocide.

Meanwhile, Defence spokesperson Stewart McDonald MP wrote in the Scotsman that Russia's invasion of Ukraine must prompt a stronger defense and commitment to international law.

SNP Backs EWIPA Declaration

The SNP have backed proposals to limit the use of explosive weapons in urban areas. SNP Foreign Affairs spokesperson, Alyn Smith MP, and the SNP Defence spokesperson Stewart McDonald MP, announced the policy ahead of a crucial UN summit in Geneva. Mr McDonald also spoke at the summit which looked at a potential international declaration limiting the use of explosive weapons in populated areas (EWIPA).

The policy is one of several that are being proposed in an upcoming paper on the Protection of Civilians produced by the MPs alongside Chris Law MP, the SNP's International Development Spokesperson.

Poland Assisting Ukraine

Stewart McDonald MP and members of the Foreign Affairs Committee visited Poland in early April to see how it is helping Ukrainians and coping with the crisis on its borders.

Stewart witnessed first-hand the response of the Polish government, international institutions and NGOs based in the country. He also met with representatives from the NATO Counter Intelligence Centre of Excellence in Krakow, the NGO Polska Akcja Humanitarna, the UNHCR and members of the Polish and Ukrainian foreign affairs committees along the Poland-Ukraine border.

Saudi Arabia Executes 81 People

There was widespread condemnation of Saudi Arabia's execution of 81 people in public earlier in March, ahead of the UK Prime Minister's visit to the country.

The matter was raised in the House of Commons by SNP Foreign Affairs spokesperson Alyn Smith MP (who grew up in Saudi Arabia during the 1980s) voicing his concerns over the executions. Speaking in the Chamber, he argued that the PM's visit should not go ahead and for the UK's programme of judicial and justice co-operation with the Saudi's should be ended or at least suspended.

UK Failing to Help Refugees with Dodgy Rwanda Deal

The UK's deal with Rwanda to offload refugees and migrants has been widely criticised for being immoral and potentially illegal, with Alyn Smith MP (SNP Foreign Affairs spokesperson) saying the UK is "once again absconding on its responsibility to help those fleeing conflict and violence."

He and other SNP MPs raised the issue at FCDO questions, which saw the government fail to convincingly answer MPs worries about the effect this disastrous policy will have on refugees.
