Ukraine Stands Strong 6 Months Later

Ukrainians celebrated the 31st Anniversary of their independence on the 24th August, a date which also marks 6 months since Russia's renewed invasion.

Writing in 'The Scotsman', SNP Defence Spokesperson Stewart McDonald MP noted how Ukrainians are not only fighting to defend their freedoms but also those across Europe and the world. He added: "The war in Ukraine serves as a sharp reminder that the future is not fixed. There is a new world incubating amidst the domestic tumult and the foreign wars, and how these problems are resolved will shape the world for generations to come. Even if we just haven't all realised it yet. Sláva Ukrayini!"

Scottish Diplomacy in the World

Scottish diplomacy can go a long way towards boosting the country's reputation and engagement argues Liz Smith MP.

Writing in his weekly National column, the SNP's Foreign Affairs spokesperson noted the importance of international engagement at all levels in the party.

He praised the recent trips of the Young Scots for Independence to Strasbourg and the Nordics, where members have formed close ties with other political young people. The Stirling MP also contrasted the positivity of Scottish actions in the world to that of 'Global Britain'.

West Must Keep Arming Ukraine

Stewart McDonald MP reiterated his call for the West to continue arming Ukraine in a column for 'The Scotsman'.

The SNP's Defence Spokesperson stated his concern that there has historically been a lack of long-term thinking in the UK's political institutions. The Glasgow South MP cited the UK's failure to hold Russia's illegal and aggressive actions in Crimea and the Donbass as one example of this. He added: "...The longer we wait [to help Ukraine], the more those options will disappear and the more expensive – in both financial and political terms – those few remaining choices will become."

Scotland Can Help Tackle Global Debt

Sri Lanka is "the canary in the coal mine of unsustainable debt" warns Liz Smith MP.

Sri Lanka has been undergoing a traumatic economic crisis which saw inflation hit 54.6% in June this year as well as extreme shortages of food and fuel. It owes more than \$51bn to foreign lenders, including \$6.5bn to China. Writing in 'The National', the SNP's Foreign Affairs spokesperson noted how many of the world's poorest countries were already in debt distress or at high risk. He added that an independent Scotland would be able to use its legal expertise in debt arbitration to help other countries around the world.




Commonwealth Games Success

Ukraine Training Needs To Continue
